#### August 2025

Our August speaker, Martha Jabour OAM, established the Homicide Victims Support Group Australia in 1993 to care for families and friends of homicide victims. The HVSG has provided life-changing counselling and support to over 2,000 members.

Using her experience across grief, trauma and crisis management, in 2013 Martha established her vision for a world-first trauma recovery facility. She inspired politicians, companies and community members to fundraise and Blacktown Council provided the land for Grace's Place which opened in 2023.

In April 2024, Grace's Place provided care for overseas families of the victims of the Sydney shopping centre attack, including accommodation, counselling and funeral assistance.

#### September 2025

In September, Nicholas Gleeson, an adventurer and author, will join us to talk about his extraordinary life. Becoming blind at seven through an accident, Nicholas continually challenged himself through school and University and went on to live a life of adventure and sport. He has competed in marathons in New York and Durban, has represented Australia in blind cricket, climbed some of the world's highest mountains and trekked across deserts. He is an advocate for people with a disability. His aim in life is to help everyone to cope with whatever challenges confront us in life.


We have organised a tour of the graveyard that surrounds St Matthews Anglican church in Windsor. The tour will be conducted by the Hawkesbury Historical Society.



The BTF group travelled to Auburn to visit the Auburn Gallipoli Mosque on Wednesday 13 August, 2025.



The General Manager Erdem welcomed us with a short history of Turkish migration to Australia and the history of the mosque building, which was completed in 1999. The architecture is based on the Ottoman style of the Marmara University Mosque & the Blue Mosque in Istanbul. It holds 1600 worshippers but up to 2000 attend Friday midday worship.

The funding was provided by the Turkish community

between 1986 and 1999 and cost \$6 million. An aged care facility next door to the mosque was partly funded by the NSW government, and cares for all aged people of any denomination.



The mosque caters to Muslims of all origins. The traditions and religious customs were also explained in much detail.



After the tour the group walked to the nearby Lebanese restaurant. Jasmine 1, and enjoyed a delicious lunch of traditional Lebanese cuisine.

#### **GARDEN CHAT**

Our Garden Chat meeting was held at The House of Herbs and Roses again this month. Points taken from the meeting were:

Air-Conditioning dries out indoor plants, so it is a good idea to take them out every 2 weeks and soak them in a bucket of water.

weeks and soak them in a bucket of water until bubbles appear.

While at this time of the year Perennials are dormant, lift them and separate them.

Neutrog Kahoona is a fertiliser for acid loving plants such as Camelias, Gardenias, Japanese Maples, Hydrangeas, Magnolias, Liriope, Rhododendron, and Tibouchina and more.

Violas for winter and Portulaca for a lovely sunny position in summer, is the suggestion for pots.

Ideas for planting colour in your garden:



Petunias: Sept -Feb: deadhead and feed with Thrive

Geraniums: Sept - Feb, extremely hardy and often flower throughout the year, they don't like too much water

Clematis: Oct- March (they like cool roots so plant in shaded area)

Hydrangeas: Nov - March (benefit from a good prune after flowering))

Roses: Nov - April (fertilize regularly and deadhead)



#### **BOOK CLUB #2**


I would like to thank Ann Woodward for running Wednesday's meeting and providing the very


I can't thank Ann enough for filling in for me, she has done an excellent job.
