She inspired politicians, companies and community members to fundraise and Blacktown Council provided the land for Grace's Place which opened in 2023. In April 2024, Grace's Place provided care for overseas families of the victims of the Sydney shopping centre attack, including accommodation, counselling and funeral assistance.



We do one every year and find it something we all enjoy.




