#### FLINDERS RANGES

After being collected from our Hotel by our Tour Guide Rita and Driver Mario, we headed off for what would be a fun packed and enlightening week. We travelled through Lochiel, Quorn, a historic railway town, and the ruins of Kanyaka which was once a thriving sheep and cattle station on our way to



Wilpena Pound where we stayed for 2 nights. Many of us took a flight over Wilpena where we were able to gain a perspective of the vastness of this breathtaking landscape.



Thanks to the amazing knowledge of our guide, we learned about the rich history in the area, dating back to the 1850's, and the hardships and tenacity of the people who worked the land in those times.

Once we reached Arkaroola there was lots more to see, do and discover. The highlight for

most of us was the 4WD trek to the top of the mountain. Nothing like getting up close and personal with your fellow Probians, strapped in on a long and teeth-

chattering climb (40 minutes to travel 7 k's on one stretch). Then to enjoy morning tea at the top with the most spectacular views, it was amazing. It was the 60<sup>th</sup> trip for our guide – what a legend!

Some of the other highlights of the trip were visits to Leigh Creek previously a thriving mining town, Peterborough. Established in the 1880's, it was once the busiest rail hub in SA and Parachilna





where Emu, Kangaroo and Camel were on the lunch menu.

On our last day we had a stop in Clare Valley for a wine tasting at Seven Hill Cellars, a wander through the Historic St.Aloysius Church, and a delicious lunch at Paulettes which capped off our fantastic experience in the Australian Outback. Then it was back home to rid our luggage of all the red dust we'd accumulated during the week!

# BTF trip with Steam Yacht Lady Hopetown (1902): Seven Island Cruise

On 27 May, approximately 30 members embarked on this magnificent vessel after making our way to Darling Harbour via bus, train or ferry to board in the glorious winter sunshine.



We were met by the various volunteer crew

members who happily chatted with us throughout the three-hour cruise and gave us an informative commentary from beginning to end.



It was breathtaking, as usual, as we steamed past the various iconic landmarks, scenes and suburbs on the harbour.



Most interesting was learning that there are 12 islands including Garden Island, Fort Denison, Clark, Berry, Shark, Spectacle, Glebe, Rodd, Goat, Bennelong, Darling and Snapper Islands. They offer various experiences from historical visits and picnicking, and are easily accessible by ferry or charter.

Volunteer engineers told us that the steam engine needed starting three hours prior to the trip and needed about half a ton of coal for its short journey around the harbour!



The engine also needed constant monitoring or it would overheat.

Afterwards lunch we had a delicious 3 course lunch at The Little Snail in Darling Harbour.
