#### **GUEST SPEAKERS**

Our August speaker was Nicole Peng who is a senior counsellor at the Homicide Victims Support Group Australia.

In 1993, Martha Jabour, the CEO of the Group, set up the HVSG to care for families and friends of homicide victims. It has provided life-changing counselling and support to over 2,000 members.

In 2013 Martha established her vision for a world-first trauma recovery facility. She inspired politicians, companies and community members to fundraise. Blacktown Council provided the land for Grace's Place which opened in 2023.



Nicole spoke about the wonderful work of the group's members across grief, trauma and crisis management. This only can occur with constant fundraising.

Below are the contact details for those members who were interested in helping the HVSG's Parramatta OP Shop.

In April 2024, Grace's Place provided care for overseas families of the victims of the Sydney shopping centre attack, including accommodation, counselling and funeral assistance.

#### September 2025

This month, Nicholas Gleeson, an adventurer and author, will join us to talk about his extraordinary life. Becoming blind at seven through an accident, Nicholas continually challenged himself through school and University and went on to live a life of adventure and sport. He has competed in marathons in New York and Durban, has represented Australia in blind cricket, climbed some of the world's highest mountains and trekked across deserts. He is an advocate for people with a disability. His aim in life is to help everyone to cope with whatever challenges confront us in life.

#### October 2025

Our final speaker for this year will be Bill Phippen who is a civil engineer and later in his career has moved into history and engineering heritage.

He has published 5 books, won many awards, including in 2010 NSW Senior Volunteer. Also, in 2013 Engineers Australia included him in their list of 100 Most Influential Engineers in the country. Bill's current project is preparing for the Centenary Celebration of the Sydney Harbour Bridge opening in 2032. Bill's talk will centre on an unsung and little-known hero, who played a vital role in the building of the Sydney Harbour Bridge.

On Monday Sep 1<sup>st</sup>, the Genealogy group had a tour of the graveyard surrounding **St Matthews Anglican Church** at Windsor.

Our tour guide as Peta Sharpley from the Hawkesbury Historical Society. The day was a glorious sunny day for our journey back in time. Here are some highlights from the very informative Peta.



It was **James Ruse and Charles Williams** who asked permission to begin a new settlement at Hawkesbury. Ruse and Williams had sold their lands at Parramatta by September 1793 and they and 20 other humble settlers were here at the Hawkesbury having chosen their own grants by January 1794.

So, the Hawkesbury became the third settlement established in the colony but the only one populated by ex-convicts and poor free settlers, [such as ex-soldiers and ex-sailors].



Settlers were being buried around the perimeter of the graveyard as the church had not yet been built. **Daniel Barnett**, a First Fleeter, was a special burial as memos in the church records state "this corpse was the first brought into the body of St Matthew's Church".

Andrew Thompson (aged 37) was the first burial at St Matthew's. [Previous to this, burials were in a paddock on the banks of South Creek or you may have been buried on your farm property.] The new burial ground's rough location had been decided on but Governor Macquarie's aide-de-camp was sent to the planned, but unannounced, new town of Windsor to decide its exact location when Andrew Thompson's death occurred 3 months before the town was formally laid out. Thompson's immense wealth gave him importance in the colony. Attendees at the funeral included William Cox, Surgeons Mileham and Redfern, Thomas Arndell and one of the Blaxland brothers.

William Cox was a soldier and after leaving the army became a successful farmer and grazier. He was appointed magistrate in 1810 and held the position until he died aged 72 Years. He was highly thought of by Governor Lachlan Macquarie for his contracting ability. He supervised the building of the road over the Blue Mountains in 1814 and was contracted to supply the bricks for the church in 1816. When his wife, Rebecca Cox (nee Upjohn and an ex-convict), died in 1819 while the church was still being built, Cox chose his wife's burial plot as far from the altar monuments of the ex-convict traders as he could, very aware that the place where he and Rebecca would be buried needed to reflect his high standing in life. The grave began an exclusive corner on the highest part of the ground.



Thomas Arndell came free as a surgeon on the First Fleet and is one of many on the First Fleet buried at St Matthew's. He became a Hawkesbury Magistrate in 1802. His wife, Elizabeth Burleigh was buried with him in 1843 when she died, although as a convict she was not included in the official parties that Arndell attended, such as Macquarie's dinner to name the towns.

Jenny Sharpe descends from the **Moore family**, assisted immigrants, who arrived in the colony from Drumquin in County Tyrone, Ireland, aboard the ship 'Maitland' in 1856. James Moore was 27 years old and was a farm labourer. Moore farmed at Llandilo and endured the devastating 1867 flood, which ravaged the Nepean and Hawkesbury districts.

James' funeral service was conducted by Rev Norman Jenkyn and JW Chandler was the undertaker. The funeral was largely attended. Pallbearers included Messrs Brinsley Hall MLA, Astronomer John Tebbutt, S Gow, W Pendergast and P Carroll. In 1913 when Mrs Moore died, her funeral also took place at St Matthew's. She had over 50 grandchildren and upwards of 20 great grandchildren.





After the tour, the group, including Peta, lunched at the historic Macquarie Arms hotel where we returned to the present time.

Though, for some of us, Peta graciously continued to give a tour of the newly revamped main street along with many anecdotes about the buildings and their inhabitants.

Many thanks go to Peta for a very informative tour and the loan of her notes as there was too much to remember.



I would like to thank Ann Woodward again for running Wednesday's meeting and providing the very informative summary that follows:



THE STATE OF THE S

Late last month this group met at the State Theatre for the "Palace of Dreams" tour.

Our guide, Stuart was a most knowledgeable man when it came to this theatre having worked

in this capacity for 27 years.



We met in the foyer where our tour commenced with Stuart giving us an overview of the initial plans and the history of this magnificent theatre.

The State Theatre opened in June 1929, owned by Union Theatres, and was to be seen as "The Empire's Greatest Theatre" designed as a picture palace. The original Wurlitzer organ remains in the theatre today (although no longer played).

As we progressed from the foyer to the Mezzanine level, we were made aware of the changes in architecture with a combination of Art Deco, Gothic and Italian. We were taken through the various levels. We viewed and accessed art work and rooms inclusive of the refurbished Butterfly Room (containing gold gilded butterfly murals). Stuart took us to the performers' dressing room where we saw posters and heard stories of various artists who had graced the stage herein.
