<u>GETTING TO KNOW YOU</u> — NIGEL GEORGE

Where did you grow up

I was born in Birmingham England and continued to live there until moving to Australia on a short term work contract in 1980 which got extended then became permanent after 3 years (the maximum period for an expatriate contract).

What did you do in your earlier work life

I joined Lucas Industries (a major automotive component manufacturer) in Birmingham where I completed a commercial apprenticeship which included a four year sandwich course at what is now the University of Aston in Birmingham studying Cost and Management Accounting.

Upon completion of my studies, I briefly held a junior management position in an electronics factory before being offered a position in

the Overseas Operations Department for Lucas Electrical. The position over time gave me the opportunity to travel to several countries including Turkey, Yugoslavia, Iran, the Philippines, Hong Kong and New Zealand. I subsequently was given a 3 year contract in Iran which came to an abrupt end after only a year due to the revolution. On the plus side this meant I was in right place at the right time when a position in Australia cropped up.

Where did you live before moving to the peninsula

Arguably you could say we have lived on the peninsula ever since moving to Australia if you include a few years in South Frankston followed by 28 years in Mount Eliza.

Why did you choose to move here

We always wanted to stay in the area, but considered the Port Philip Bay side to be too busy particularly in the summer. Through our children's schooling we already knew a number of people in Somers and we had been regular attendees at the Yacht Club New Years Eve

parties so it was an easy decision.

How long have you lived in the area

We purchased in Somers in 2010 but didn't move in permanently until 2013

Anything you miss by moving here

No not at all family and friends are still not that far away.

What advice would you give anyone contemplating a similar move

Don't hesitate, Somers is an amazing place, quiet and very inclusive. Our immediate neighbourhood is a very close community and this appears to be the norm in various parts of Somers

How long have you been involved with Probus

Around about 8 years

What motivated you to join Probus

Hadn't ever given it any thought. Our next door neighbours, who shall remain nameless, convinced us that there was a long waiting list so we should put our names down at the earliest opportunity.

What do you enjoy about Probus

The opportunity to mix with a wide variety of people. Have enjoyed and still enjoy the friendship of a number of people that we might not have otherwise met or normally considered possible friends. Access to a variety of activities is another reason although we probably don't take full advantage of this.

What if anything would you like changed about Probus

Having been on the committee for almost 7 years now, I am well aware how much the club is dependent on a small number of volunteers who offer their time for the committee and running activities. I would just like to see a greater number offering up a little of their time to support their club. It doesn't have to be that onerous and it can actually be fun.


