What is the new national seniors travel agreement for concession fares?

The new national seniors travel agreement for concession fares in Australia, effective from November 1, 2025, is a government initiative that allows seniors cardholders from any Australian state or territory to access senior concession fares on public transport nationwide. This means if you hold a valid Seniors Card issued in one state, you can use it to receive concession travel benefits such as reduced fares on buses, trains, ferries, and light rail when traveling in other states without needing to apply for local concession cards This adds convenience and cost savings for interstate travel. Seniors may use their original Seniors Card for tap on/tap off concession travel, and in some cases, can apply for a Gold Senior/Pensioner Opal Card or equivalent local card for additional benefits such as daily fare caps and discounts

In summary, the national seniors travel agreement ensures seniors with concession cards from any state can travel on public transport in Sydney and other Australian jurisdictions at senior concession rates, supporting easier interstate travel for older Australians.


# November Speaker.
