Visit to the Australian Regenerative Medicine Institute at Monash University 11:00an on Tuesday 5th August Location: Level 1, 15 Innovation Walk, Monash University Clayton Campus

The STEM group invite our Probus members to visit the Australian Regenerative Medicine Institute (ARMI) at Monash University, Clayton. This visit has been facilitated by Dr Peter Rogers AM.

The work of the Australian Regenerative Medicine Institute can be summarised by an Introduction from Director of Research, Professor Peter Currie on their website:

"Throughout life, our human bodies are vulnerable to disease, injury and, in some cases, congenital conditions that impair or shorten life.

With Australia's ageing population, health issues such as heart disease, stroke and Alzheimer's are on the rise. To tackle these challenges, the Australian Regenerative Medicine Institute is focused on regaining the body's remarkable regenerative capacity of damaged tissues and organs that all people have before birth.

Investigating how the body repairs, replaces, restores or regenerates damaged tissues and organs could hold the key to help unlock the body's own potential to heal and regenerate back to optimal health from an injury or disease."

Transport options:

By car or car-pooling. A list of participants will be circulated in late July, to enable members to arrange for carpooling between themselves.

Alternatively, Monash University can be reached by public transport: The most efficient public transport route from Melbourne CBD to Monash University's Clayton campus is by train to Huntingdale Station, followed by a short bus ride to the campus bus interchange.
