
#### **BOOK CLUB**

Goodreads describes it as:



The club's trip to Port Douglas next July is attracting keen interest with 16 now booked to go.

With a minimum of 20 required there are still vacancies so, if you are considering, I would suggest contacting Ashleigh Hughes of Trade Travel on 1800 034 439 to avoid disappointment.

As the locals say: 'Barefoot in winter - why not?'.

If you have not been to this part of Far North Queensland in the depths of a Melbourne winter you can expect warm, dry, sunny weather with temperatures ranging from 25C to 26C on average, dropping to a mild 17C to 19C at night.

With low humidity, July is considered the ideal time to visit.

The itinerary has been structured to offer not only the major attractions, such as a day trip to Agincourt Reef on the outer Great Barrier Reef - a once-in-a-lifetime experience, as is the World Heritage listed Daintree rainforest - but essential free time so you can discover the real pleasure of being in this tropical paradise.

I'm referring to Four Mile Beach (pictured this July), one of the finest in Australia.

Mantra PortSea, where club guests will stay for six nights beginning July 18, offers direct access. Catching a sunrise from the beach or walking the kilometre into town on pure white sand or at the water's edge or riding a bike along the same stretch is definitely a must.

In future posts I will have more to say about the fabulous food scene in Port Douglas - in my opinion, one of the best anywhere.
