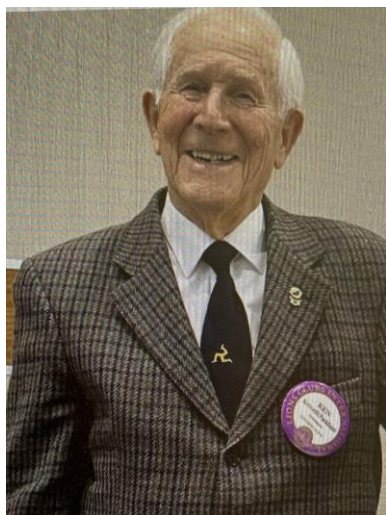
Meeting Monday FEBRUARY 16
