to monitor and record data for NSW Turtle Watch. For at least 25 years locals have seen sea turtles, a threatened species, at Diamond Beach - Loggerhead, Green Hawksbill and occasional are laid in a nest, the survival rate being 85%. They have a 1:100 waters of the East Australian
