

### REPORT ON OUR AUGUST OUTING

Our group of 24 members all had a most Interesting outing to the SAHMRI BUILDING where our guides, Michele Brooke and Terry, explained the wonderful work in medical research being carried out.

SAHMRI is an independent health and medical research institute located in South Australia.

The iconic building, opened in November 2013, was designed by Adelaide-based architectural firm Woods Bagot. It's signature dia-grid façade, has earned the building the nickname 'The Cheesegrater', being inspired by the skin of a pinecone.

SAHMRI's primary goal is to conduct high-quality health and medical research that leads to improved healthcare for Australians.

The building has over 700 researchers and is energy efficient with heating and cooling and ventilation systems throughout, along with rain water harvesting for the building and the landscaped area adjoining.

SAHMRI believe in creating healthier futures for all Australians and the researchers have access to state of the art technology to assist them with ground breaking improvements being achieved in areas of health. Some of the current areas of research are Aboriginal Health, Dementia in children, Parkinson's disease, Brain cancer and Pain management.

Adelaide is very fortunate to have this amazing facility which is only 1 of 3 in the world, and is achieving great results in medical research.

Our group then caught the tram down North Terrace and had lunch at the Strathmore where we had plenty to talk about after our very educational visit to the SAHMRI BUILDING.
