REPORT ON OUTING

MONDAY 13TH OCTOBER, SA WATER DESALINATION PLANT AT LONSDALE

This tour is know as "The Well" and is an educational program which gives an insight into the story of water in our lives and the ways we manage this precious natural resource to deliver essential water services to more than 1.8 million South Australians.

Our guide Tracey, spoke about the many processes involved in the desalination of sea water to make it safe to drink.

The Adelaide Plant at Lonsdale is the state's largest desalination plant, which is able to produce 100 gigalitres a year, and it has been delivering drinking water since 2011.

Water produced at the Adelaide Desalination Plant is pumped 11 kilometres to storage tanks at the Happy Valley Water Treatment Plant where it is blended with treated water from Happy Valley Reservoir and can supply drinking water produced at the Adelaide Desalination Plant to people across Adelaide, from Aldinga in the south, through to Elizabeth in the north.

The tour was very educational and our group thoroughly enjoyed learning how our state is leading in the preservation of our most precious resource, WATER. After the tour we all enjoyed our lunch at the newly renovated Lonsdale Hotel.


