Guest speaker **Graeme Jupp,** has had a long interest in maritime history and is the author of 'Titanic 366 Days'. His subject on this occasion was Shackleton's failed 1914 expedition to Antarctic. His talk along with photos taken by the ship's photographer Frank Hurley was very detailed and well researched. Ernest Henry Shackleton had first visited Antarctic in 1901 with Scott, but it ended

Ernest Henry Shackleton had first visited Antarctic in 1901 with Scott, but it ended badly when he was sent home early with scurvy and other health problems. In 1913 he raised funds from Royal Geographical Society, Government and three wealthy sponsors Sir James Caird, Frank Docker and Janet Stancomb-Wills to attempt to cross Antarctic, Ross Sea to Weddell Sea, via the South Pole. Two ships the Aurora and the Endurance were used, with the former to go to McMurdo Sound to lay supply depots along the route. The Endurance was to take the crossing party to Vahsel Bay in the Weddell Sea. The Endurance left Plymouth on 8th August 1914, and Buenos Aires on 26th October. By 18th January 1914 the Endurance was beset by ice. After several attempts to break through the ice it became apparent that the crew would have to winter over.

After again attempting to break through the ice in September 1915 the ship became trapped in the ice and the crew salvaged all available stores and the life rafts. On the 21st November the ship sank beneath sea. After drifting on ice, the crew finally made it to Elephant Island more than 500 days since they had stood on solid ground. They set up camp and made one of the lifeboats as seaworthy as possible. On 26th April 1916 Shackleton along with navigator Frank Worlsey, carpenter Harry McNish and 2 others set sail for South Georgia arriving 16 days later. The 7 men still on Elephant Island were rescued by Shackleton in January 1917 just a few days before their meagre food supplies ran out.

Shackleton died of a heart attack on 5th January 1922 aged 48 at South Georgia and is buried on the island. On 5th March 2022 the wreck of the Endurance was located by robot and due to the cold waters of the Antarctic the timbers have not rotted away.
