#### **Guest Speaker**

Guest speaker **Dame Catherine Healy,** gave an interesting talk on her life and the NZ Sex Workers Collective. She was brought up and lived most of her life in Days Bay, attended Muritai Primary School, and Hutt Valley High School where she became a prefect. She then studied at Teachers' College, Victoria University and on graduating taught in schools in the Hutt Valley and Wellington for 9 years. Her interest in travel and the costs involved lead her to seek a second job on the weekends. Starting as receptionist at a massage parlour, where her job was to collect the money and 'knock on the door' after 30 minutes, lead her into the sex industry.

With the emergence of AIDS she became an advocate for sex workers health. In October 1987 the NZ Prostitutes Collective was formed and in 1988 they signed a contract with the Government to fund health care for the members. A new three-year contract has been signed recently. The group also campaigned to decriminalise prostitution with the law finally passing in the house by 1 vote in 2003. Since the law was passed the sex workers have a far better relations with the police.

The organization run by sex workers, now has 4 drop-in centres throughout NZ and focus on the rights, HIV, STI prevention and education. Their work also involved such things as facilitating acceptance of sex workers by neighbours on the street in Manchester St Christchurch. Most sex workers now work in brothels and the organization in the main has a good relationship with the owners. NZ Sex Workers Collective symbol is red umbrellas. The industry is now referred to as sex workers not prostitutes. They are funded by Government and earn additional money through a small import business. Despite all the progress over the years discrimination still exists and many sex workers do not disclose their vocation. Dame Catherine also spoke of the work Carmen and Georgina Beyer did to try to end discrimination against sex workers in NZ, such as some banks refusing to open accounts for them.
