## **WOLLONDILLY HERITAGE CENTRE**

It was a rainy day with single temperatures when 24 very cold Probus members travelled to the Oaks to see the Wollondilly Heritage Centre, carefully and thankfully arranged by Deb and Glenn Denny.

The Centre is the home of The Oaks Historical Society, run by volunteers that not only manage it, but also collect, research and interpret the material culture and local history of the Wollondilly Shire and Burragorang Valley, in cooperation with other organisations and the community, to better appreciate the present by an increased understanding of the past.

Glenn greeted us all at the gate and ushered us through to an undercover area where the lovely lady volunteers had a very delicious morning tea ready and waiting for us, including hot drinks, devonshire teas and a few slices. That certainly helped us to thaw a little before our guide, Vicki Madeley (one of the Marketing Officers), took us to the "Drill Hall" where we had a really informative talk about the Centre and its volunteer staff. This was followed by a short film on the clearing and flooding of the Burragorang Valley making way for Sydney's new water supply, the Warragamba Dam.

We were then allowed to walk freely around the Centre, dodging the rain, looking at all the fascinating historical displays in the other buildings, including the The Oaks Blacksmith Shop, Burragorang Cottage, the Faces & Places Building, the From Farm to Table Pavilion and finally, The Exhibition Building.

There were recreations of historic living and dining areas, kitchen facilities, farm equipment, a school classroom, blacksmith memorabilia showing horse shoeing techniques.

It was quite disconcerting seeing various implements, such as school desks and books, hand tools, some office equipment and kitchen items that I can clearly remember using as a child, appearing in a museum. Am I really THAT old.

On departing the museum, we had only a very short trip down the road to The Oaks Hotel for lunch. Once bingo had finished, we ordered our meals and it appeared that all had a really delicious lunch. Our numbers had slightly grown for lunch and the pub handled surge of customers so well.

Once more, a huge thanks to Deb and Glenn for a really wonderful day.

For anybody who missed today and others who would like to return there will also be the "Traditional Trades & Crafts Fair" at The Centre on Sunday 14 September which is a public event. It's between 10 am and 3 pm.
