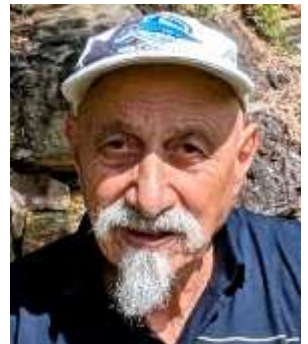


### **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**
