



PORT KEMBLA WORKING PORTS TOUR – WEDNESDAY 15TH APRIL 2026

TOUR HIGHLIGHTS.

The tour commences with a train trip to Coniston railway station arriving at 10.02 am to be picked up by shuttle bus and conveyed to the Inside industry visitor centre for an introduction and briefing to the safety requirements. We will be required to complete and sign an online tour waiver form as part of the check in. There are no PPE requirements for this tour, but it is recommended that participants wear sturdy, enclosed shoes, a hat and bring water with them. We then hop on the tour bus for a quick stop a Greenhouse Park to get a bird's eye view of the port. Check out the Inner Harbour, home to major operations like the Port Kembla Coal Terminal, (NSW second largest), Grain Terminal, the state's biggest motor vehicle import hub, and the cruise ship berth. Key supporting industries like automotive, mining, agriculture, manufacturing and construction. Get a glimpse of the Steelworks and hear about the steel industry. Visit the Outer Harbour with a stop at Christy Dr for fantastic views of the Inner Harbour. Wrap up the tour at Hill 60 for panoramic views of the Illawarra coastline and Lake Illawarra. Return to the Visitor Centre for the Shuttle transfer to Coniston Hotel for lunch.

Easy (driving tour, alighting the bus in public areas weather permitting) **Accessibility appropriate** for wheelchair /walkers (upon request) Our group will be picked up at Coniston Railway Station by the tour shuttle bus at 10.02am from the South Coast train departing Sutherland 8.45am or Waterfall 8.58 am. Connecting T4 train from Loftus 8.33am, Engadine 8.38am Heathcote 8.41am to change at Waterfall. Returning to the Coniston station at the end of the tour at approximately 1pm for lunch. The Coniston Hotel is opposite the Coniston railway station with a bistro open for lunch all afternoon for your own choice and expense

Walk Report, Monday 12th January - Leichhardt to Dulwich Hill - Via the Greenway.


