These first 3 surprisingly rated well if we look back at our local reds.

The Bordeaux from Southwest France was a blend of Cab sav Cab Franc and Merlot.

The Pinot Noir was a wine from the Burgandy region in Nort-east France

Afraid the Gamay came a poor last, seemed a bit 'off'?

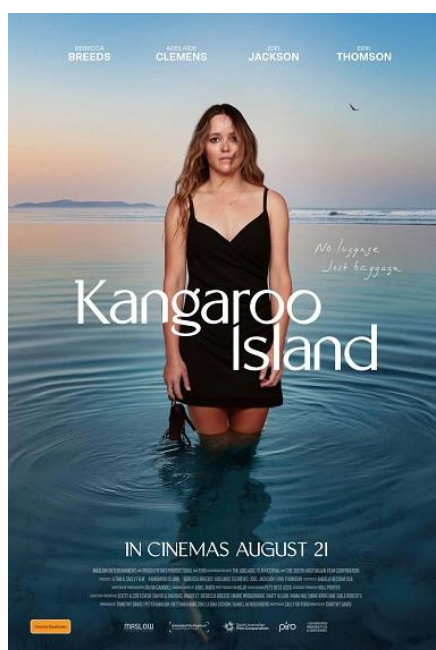

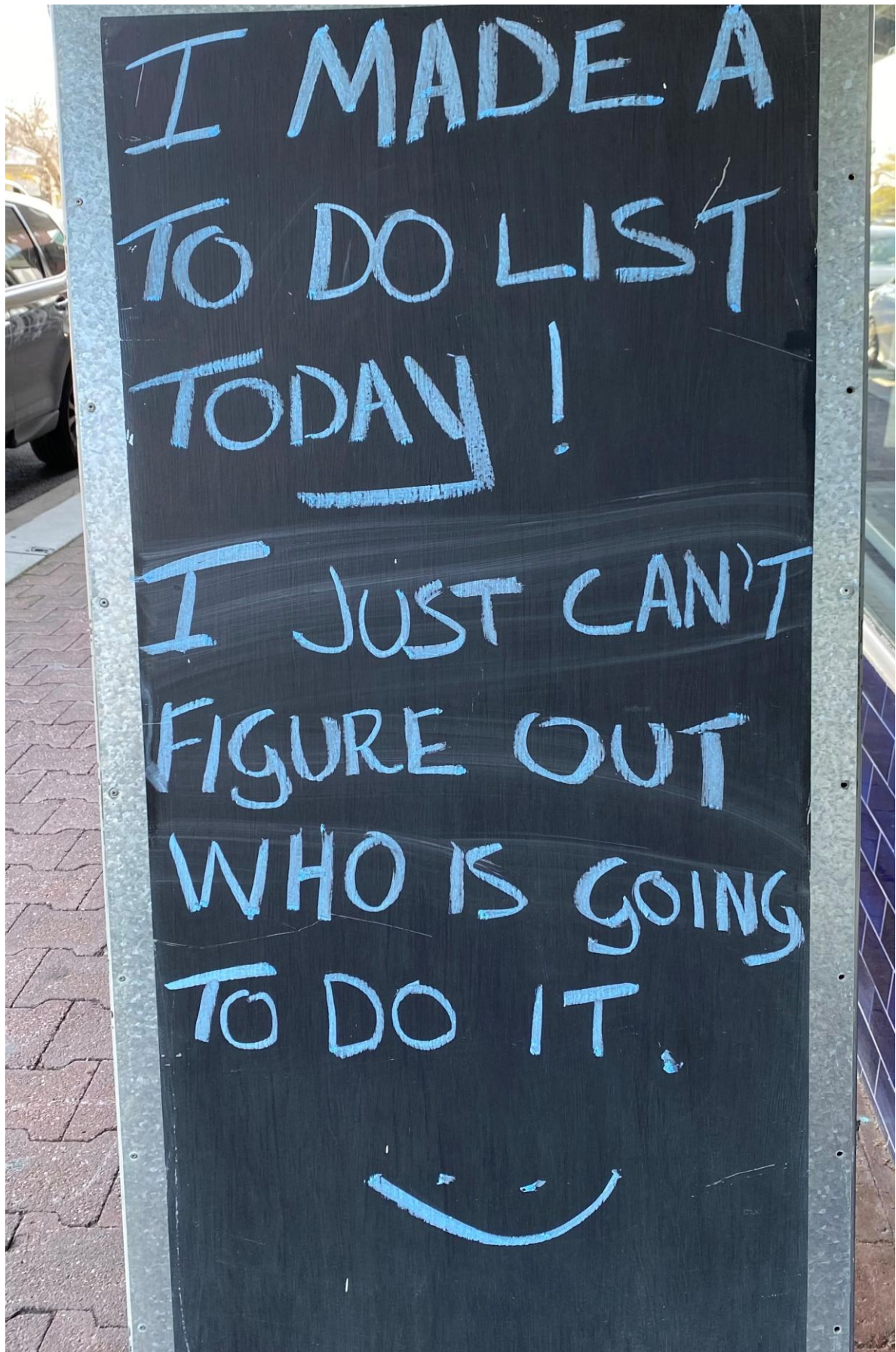
