## **Guest Speaker**

Kelly-Mare Korcek was introduced by Bruce Clark. Kelly is a Director of Hearing Sense, and she presented a very profession and interesting talk about the workings of the ear and hearing.

Kelly introduced her business and then talked on the principles behind hearing and the interaction with the brain. She proceeded with the problems that occur and the effects of wax. She continued with the problems of otosclerosis,

then the causes of Sensorineural hearing loss, such as needing louder TV, background noise etc and what action to take and advised members to act early. Kelly proceeded with the 9 factors effecting dementia including hearing loss. She explained tinnitus and how tests are made and some solutions including 3 types of hearing aids, in the ear, behind the ear, lyric and cochlear implants. She concluded with some presents for a small quiz.
