Guest Speaker

Robert Davis was introduced by Bruce Clark, with Robert talking about the Clipper ship "City of Adelaide.

Robert started with the history of the "City of Adelaide", built 1864 and its role in transporting up to 300 settlers each trip to SA. The ship made 23 such trips and then became a cargo transport vessel. It was also nearly scraped but became a hospital. Then in the Royal Navy, as HMS Carrick (1923-89). She was salvaged in the late 80s, to be restored as a museum. Ultimately recovered by a group in SA and is being set up as a museum in Port Adelaide. Robert described some of the details of the ship with some of the noted people in SA who were immigrants via her.


