
President's Challenge

These include 3 times crossing the finish line in the New York City Marathon, carrying the Sydney Olympic Torch, racing up the 1,576 steps of the Empire State Building and completing the gruelling 90km from Durban to Pietermaritzburg in the Comrades ultra-Marathon.


Pretty Woman – Wednesday 4th February 2026 - Theatre Royal Sydney


