CLUB SECRETARY'S REPORT: Ross Berghofer**Club meeting and Annual General Meeting - 3 March 2026**

Our next club year commences after our March 2026 annual general meeting. Our March get-together will comprise our usual monthly meeting followed by the annual general meeting. The business of the annual general meeting will comprise an overview of the past year's activities, confirmation of the minutes of the 2025 AGM and election of office bearers for the forthcoming club year 2026-27, setting the membership fee for the year, and confirming volunteer helpers.

The honorary positions for election are president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and a minimum of two committee members with no maximum number. I will have nomination forms at the 3 February meeting. Self-nominations are welcome and encouraged. I can email you a nomination form if you require one - send me an SMS or email.

Our membership fee will be reviewed - please do not renew your membership until after the annual general meeting; fees are set at the annual general meeting based on a recommendation for an amount by the club committee. The membership cap is also decided at an AGM. At the time of writing this, no decisions or recommendations have been made as to an amount or cap.

Update to our club's constitution

Two issues have been drawn to attention regarding our new constitution. At our February meeting, members will be asked to formally note and approve these updating amendments to our constitution, as follows.

Firstly, the registered name of the club with the Office of Fair Trading is *The Probus Club of Strathfield Inc.* Paragraph 1 of the constitution that defines the club's name, but somehow or other the following words "(C) ("the Club")" were included in the new version. Clearly, those words are not part of the official name of the club; therefore they should be removed. The "C" refers to a combined male and female club.

The other item is in relation to the club's financial year. Paragraph 16 (b) of the

constitution refers to the club's financial year as from April to March. What was overlooked is that it is not possible to present audited financial information to a March annual general meeting in that timeframe. To amend this typographical error, the financial year is to be from 1 February to 31 January.
