Notes from the President

Hello all Raumati Probus Members.

Welcome to the first fleeting days of spring. Spring daffodils, pretty spring gardens, lambs running around, even if the weather reverts to winter as well.

We are so blessed with great 10-minute and main speakers. Trish, who is a wizard with the way she tracks down new and interesting speakers, can conjure up our own local people when last-minute circumstances dictate. I too, am lucky, being able to invite members of the calibre of Heather Wakeling to speak.

Heather gave us a wonderful insight into the West Coast and their special brand of fellowship and friendship. Then Jim McIntosh enthralled us with his visit to Mongolia. Jim and Kay were lucky enough to be Ambassadors for the Friendship Force, chosen to foster friendship beyond cultural and international borders. They travelled by air, train and local

transport, drank horse milk, goats milk and witnessed the life of a nomadic herd among the low middle and highlands of Mongolia. They travelled 1500 miles in a van with broken suspension. Jim elicited a laugh when showing us the "ladies' restroom" — a picture of a field with ladies squatting everywhere.

The monasteries were a thing of the past Russian era as the monks had been slaughtered. The animals were yaks, cows, goats, camels and horses - all with very strong breeding lines to withstand either -40 degrees or plus 40 degrees in the summer.

The Mongolians were all wearing western clothes, except when they wore their elaborate traditional garb for ceremonies. Everyone had a TV run by solar power.

The Mongolians exist on 6L of water per person per day. Average Kapiti usage 235L.

Mongolia was the largest and longest-lasting empire in the world. It is a very poor country - now living in the legacy of Russian times - no power, no running water, no sewage systems. Noticeable in the accompanying photos is that the older generation don't smile, probably because of living under the Russian system. The population have some of the healthiest teeth due to lack of sugar in their diet. That, sadly, is changing with the introduction of fast-food chains.

Although the trip was a few years ago now, it was a fascinating insight into a nation still clinging onto the older traditions. Farming as we know it would not be viable as it would require infrastructure that is just not available. To me the Mongolians lead a simple but rich cultural life.

We welcomed Ann and Tony Williams into our Club in August and look forward to inducting three more members in September.

In the future, October (Probus Month) promises to be a beauty with our Indoor Field Day and a mystery speaker. Don't forget to invite your friends.
