
Thankyou, Terry, and congratulations on being our newest Life Member.

TRIP TO THE WOOLSHED AND HERITAGE WALK, SANSON

Wednesday 19th of November

<u>The Woolshed Cafe & Heritage Walk</u> in Sanson features seven relocated and restored New Zealand houses from the 1860s to the 1960s, offering visitors a walk through time with authentic furnishings and audio guides detailing the history and events of each era. The attraction, started by local businessman Alan Parker, provides a chronological timeline of New Zealand life, with buildings ranging from a 1860s colonial cottage to a 1960s weatherboard cottage.

What to Expect

• Historic Homes:

The walk includes seven houses, each restored to its original state and furnished to reflect a specific decade.

Chronological Experience:

The houses are presented in order from the earliest (an 1860s colonial cottage) to the latest (a 1960s weatherboard cottage).

Audio Guide:

An audio guide provides detailed information about each house, the national and international events that shaped that era, and what life was like for the people who lived there.

Key Features

- Collection of Eras: Visitors can see examples of different architectural styles and interior designs from New Zealand's past.
- **Restoration Efforts:** Each house is a testament to the restoration work done to preserve them and their connection to history.
- Location: The Heritage Walk is located at The Woolshed Cafe in Sanson, Manawatū.
