PAST EVENT

Guided Tour of the Archibald, Wynn and Sulman prizes Art Gallery of NSW on Friday 13 June 2025

On a crisp, sunny winter's day, fifteen Probus Cremorne members and friends made our way to the Art Gallery of NSW to view the exhibition of this year's finalists for the Sulman, Archibald and Wynne prizes. Interestingly our group was all women, perhaps reflecting that this year for the first time more women artists than men had been selected for each of the prizes.

We were met at the entrance by Susan Mitchell, our knowledgeable guide who deftly steered us through the crowds to ensure we had prime positions in front of key paintings. With 139 paintings selected for exhibition from the almost 2,400 entries, she guided us to the main highlights, including the winners of each prize.

For over a century the Archibald Prize has been awarded annually to the best portrait of a person "distinguished in art, letters, science or politics" by an Australasian artist. The prize has always created controversy and conversation, and this year was no exception.



This year's winner, a black and white portrait, entitled *Flagship Mother Multiverse* by Julie Fragar was not everyone's favourite with some of the Probus art critics preferring the portrait of Gardening Australia's gnome, Costa, or the Packing Room prizewinner, Abdul Abdullah's portrait of fellow artist on horseback, *No Mountain High Enough*.



However, the Sulman Prize winner, a large, colourful canvas with swirls of bright colour by Gene A'Hern entitled *Sky Painting* was more popular with the Probians - fireworks! was our reaction. Moving on, the winner of the Wynne prize for landscape painting, Jude Rae's *Pre-dawn Sky Over Botany Container Terminal* was perhaps a bit too dark and monochromatic for our tastes.







But there's only so much art one can appreciate in a morning, and after viewing many of the paintings on exhibition we thanked Susan for her guidance and made our way to lunch.
