It is at this time I need to discuss the difficulties I am having as the Day Coach Tour coordinator.

- All the tours I have offered are from the results of the survey I emailed out at the beginning of the year in which only 15 people replied which is only 13% of the whole club. I was very disappointed with that result but have proceeded to continue regardless.
- 2. Coach costs have increased since I first started and depend on numbers
 - 20 members highest expense
 - 30 members medium expense
 - 40 members lowest expense

It makes my job very difficult when I have to guess in advance how many members are going to cancel so I can set the price. It is very stressful. I do understand illness and medical appointments can be the main reason for cancellation but changing your mind or to do other outings is no reason to cancel. Please note when you put your name down you are making a commitment to attend. If you are unsure please do not put your name down to attend.

3. I have had complaints that the tours are too expensive for couples but I cannot do anything about that unless we have more members attending. I have had complaints and members saying they want to drive to save the cost of a coach but I have asked amongst the members going on the coach and they say they do not want to drive especially the single ladies. The whole idea of a coach tour is to go on the coach and chat to your fellow members and perhaps make a new friend or two. Also it would mean I would need to do all the organisation and prepare the itinerary and book everything and be responsible on the day.

I have received information on day trips organised by Coach Holidays and Tours and they are very interesting and I would like to organise them. Once again the price is dependent on numbers. We could all enjoy much cheaper day trips if we have the numbers.

What would members need me to do to encourage more numbers?

The day trips are held every two months, six times a year. Do you want me to do trips only four times a year or do you want me to cancel them altogether?

Guest Speaker Report for September Newsletter

As I was unable to get to the August Meeting, Ginny Thompson kindly stepped up and introduced our speakers and wrote the following appraisal of their presentation. Thanks Ginny! It seems like these fellas know all about feet!

"Our guest speakers for August were Nelson Dale and Matthew Morley of Pinnacle Podiatry in Gymea, who reminded us of the importance of maintaining foot health. They pointed out that balance and joint issues can be traced back to foot problems left untreated for too long. They demonstrated easy exercises to improve our balance and reminded us that there is no one, definitive, great shoe brand; the only "great" shoes are designed for specific purposes and different types of feet, and they provided a range of these shoes for members to investigate. They also answered questions about common foot problems: corns and bunions, flat feet, hammer toes, ingrown toenails and the use of orthotics to support fallen arches. In all it was an interesting presentation, and probably convinced us to be more aware of foot health and its importance in the ageing process."
