Train leaves Heathcote 9-59, Engadine 10-02, Loftus 10-06, Sutherland 10-09. We will change trains at Town Hall for Circular Quay. After a toilet stop we will catch the ferry to Pyrmont Bay. It is a flat, easy 10 minute, walk across the park to Star City where we will catch the light rail, one stop to John Street Square. There is a lift up to street level, it is a 5 minute walk to the Bridge Hotel at 96 Union Street.

The history dates back to 1858, it was then known as the Native Rose, Boylans Hotel 1913, Montgomery Hotel 1930's before becoming the Pyrmont bridge Hotel in 1998. The hotel is known for its Federation Freestyle architecture which has been beautifully restored. The hotel has a history as a social

Last month's topic was 'What is Science?' As it happened, this was the most popular topic so far attracting the largest 'crowd' so far. It set a record, hopefully, to be broken in August. Our next outing will be on **Thursday 21st August to Shire Succulents**, 401 President Ave., Gympie.



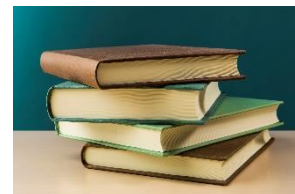
