Report

Thank you to Ginny for writing the following report for our October Speaker, and to Garriock for organising Geoffrey to come and share his story.

"Our Guest Speaker for October was Mr Geoffrey Benn, a retired solicitor, who founded the Fromelles Association, a volunteer service that is trying to identify the remains of the 250 Australian soldiers found in a mass grave from the battle at Fromelles. This battle resulted in 5,500 Australian

casualties, the greatest loss of men in one day in all wars, many of whom were never recovered or were interred in mass graves.

He explained that since 2014, the New South Wales-based group has helped to connect the remains of soldiers who died in Fromelles with their living relatives through comprehensive research and DNA testing.

Through this, Mr Benn was connected to the remains of his own great uncle, Private William Polding Ryan, in 2010. The discovery compelled him to want to help other families find the remains of lost relatives. He related several anecdotes of other successful searches where families were connected with the remains of their lost relatives.

This informative and interesting presentation demonstrated Geoffrey's passion for finding identification for the fallen soldiers of Fromelles." - Ginny Thompson


Next, we had a tour of Coffs
