President's message :

Hi All,

Hopefully you are managing to survive the heat and humidity.

As you are aware, the end of our Probus year is approaching – our final monthly meeting and our Annual General Meeting are scheduled for Monday 9th March 2026. At this meeting you will be required to vote on the proposed annual fees for the upcoming 2026 – 2027 Probus financial year which runs from 1st April to 31st March. An email will be sent to all members in the near future, with details of the recommended annual fee for the upcoming year.

As advised at the last monthly meeting in January, we are unable to accept cash payments to the Treasurer over the table at the monthly meetings. The preferred method of payment is via electronic funds transfer or if you wish to pay cash, you can deposit it at the Commonwealth Bank in Engadine, using our usual methods, as if paying for an activity you wish to go on. Please note the Annual Membership fees must be paid to our club by 31st March 2026.

The other item to be carried out at the Annual General Meeting is the declaration of all Committee, Activity Coordinator and Office Bearer positions as vacant and an election or appointment of nominated persons to those roles as required.

It takes a minimum of thirty positions to run this club in a manner which you have all become accustomed to over the past few years. It takes a minimum of thirty positions to make this one of the better performing clubs under the Probus umbrella. Currently, at the time of writing this article, we have twenty positions with people good enough to put up their hands to help out your club. Thank you to all those people who have volunteered to help and fill a position.

We still need ten more members to nominate for a position to be able to run this club, how you know it can be run. Even if two or three people band together to run an activity, to share the load, it is acceptable. At this stage we do not have a Vice-President, a Theatre Coordinator, Coach Tours Coordinator, Sunset Cocktails Coordinator, Walking Coordinator, Book Swap Coordinator, Photographer, Ambassador or Auditor. This means the club will not be organizing any activities where we do not have a nomination, it means at this stage – ***you will not be doing any of the above activities!***

I find it difficult to understand how we can have one hundred and thirty members and are struggling to get up to thirty people to do their bit to help.

In late 2024, it was proposed to rename Port Hacking as Port Hacking Deeban – 'Deeban' being the presumed indigenous name for the area. The hope is that over time, 'Port Hacking' will fall out of use as has happened at Uluru. A certain nostalgia is evident in discussing this issue but locality names are not sacrosanct. 'Bottleforest' was changed to 'Heathcote'. The mood of the meeting was to stick with the familiar, long known names. However, one interesting comment was that, perhaps, by restoring indigenous names to localities might help restore some pride and self-respect to the indigenous population.




