REMEMBERING THE 60'S

At our October meeting, we welcomed back Garry Kerr, who had entertained us earlier this year with his presentation "The Golden Age of Musical Comedy".

On this occasion, Garry presented another very enjoyable afternoon of music and memories from a decade of much change and new beginnings - the 1960's.

Beginning with the year 1961, Garry detailed all the major events and musical hits of each successive year of this eventful decade.

Major political events included the election of President Kennedy and the later assassinations of both him and Martin Luther



King, the building of the Berlin Wall, the Profumo affair, and the Cuban Missile crisis. Other major changes included the death of Marilyn Munroe, commencement of decimal currency, and Jean Shrimpton shocking Flemington with her mini skirt.

He showed us wonderful videos of performances of some of the most popular songs of the 60's. Artists included Elvis Presley, (a wonderful performance of the smash hit "Wooden Heart" accompanied by a choir of German children), Tony Bennett, Cilla Black, Dusty Springfield, and Engleburt Humperdink,

Who can forget The Seekers (I'll never find another you "? and of course The Beatles (She loves you". The 1964 video of the Beatles' tour of Melbourne, being welcomed by thousands of screaming fans outside the Southern Cross Hotel, bought back happy memories to many, including myself.

Garry transported us back to an interesting time in our history, a time of change, musically, culturally and politically. A very enjoyable afternoon!
