As I sit to write my news letter this month it is with a heavy heart that I must report the passing of our long time member Rob Bromley.


I'm sure you will all be saddened to hear Rob passed away on 29th September after a short illness.

AT OUR LAST MEETING

Our Speaker: Darren Arnott

WW11 internment camp in Rowville

Our September speaker was historian and author Darren Arnott, who spoke about an internment camp for Italian prisoners of war, that operated in Rowville (where Darren grew up) during World War two. The campsite, on the corner of Stud and Wellington Roads, which was previously used by Australian, then US troops earlier in the war, was untouched until the 1980s, when a housing estate was built there. Some roads and foundations are still in existence today.

Through researching archives, Darren was able to discover much information about the prisoners and their life in the camp.

Approximately 130,000 prisoners were captured in Africa and the Australian Government took 18,000 of them, sending them to various camps, where they were mainly employed on local farms.



The Rowville internment camp which was operational between December 1944, and August 1946 was classed as a "Hostel". It was a low security camp, enclosed by a single wire fence. The men had their own canteen and cooks.

A controversial and tragic incident occurred in March 1946, when a prisoner, Rudolfo Batoli was shot and killed by the camp commandant, Captain John Walker Waterson. The official reason for the shooting given by Captain Waterson was that Batoli was attempting to escape, and had ignored warnings to desist.

At a subsequent Military Court of Inquiry Captain Waterson was exonerated. At a later enquiry headed by Major Archer, witnesses gave evidence that no warnings were heard, either verbal or shooting. Also, witnesses stated that Captain Waterson had been known to be drunk and beat prisoners.

However, again Captain Waterson and his staff were cleared of any wrong doing.

Darren looked at the original Coroner's Report, untouched since 1946, and viewed the crime scene and Captain Waterson's original handwritten report.

At a later enquiry, Captain Waterson was found guilty of assault only and received a reprimand.

Darren was convinced that a miscarriage of justice occurred in this instance, and he determined to give Rudolfo Batoli voice. His book about the Batoli incident, "No Regard for the Truth "was shortlisted for the Victorian History Community Awards in 2020.

Darren gave his presentation with enthusiasm and passion, bringing to light a little known but important part of our local history.


