#### **ATTRACTIONS**

#### Castlemaine Art Museum

Founded in 1913, it is housed in a purpose-built Art Deco building, completed in 1931 and heritage-listed by the National Trust. Its collection concentrates on Australian art and the museum houses historical artefacts and displays drawn from the local district.



#### Castlemaine Botanical Gardens

This is one of Victoria's earliest botanic gardens, and boasts many heritage listed native and exotic trees, including an oak tree planted by the Duke of Edinburg in 1867.



#### The Mill

Come and discover the unexpected around every corner at The Mill Castlemaine; home to more than 40 artisan makers set in an 1870s woollen mill.

The food precinct with individual small businesses includes: a coffee roastery, winemakers, sourdough baker, craft brewery, smallgoods maker, cheese and dairy producer, and ice cream maker.

The artisan precinct includes makers of furniture, bath soaks and perfumery, wool-centric clothing, mosaics and an ethical florist.



## **Buda Historic Home and Garden**

Nestled in the heart of Castlemaine, Central Victoria, Buda is an authentic Goldfields villa house and garden. Named after Budapest by its Hungarian owner, Ernest Leviny, this historic home was the heart of the creative Leviny family for an incredible 118 years. Today, Buda remains a Museums Australia accredited museum, showcasing an extraordinary intact collection of furniture, artwork, and personal belongings.



## XXXX Antiques

A treasure trove for antique enthusiasts, XXXX Antiques Complex in Castlemaine offers over 30,000 unique pieces, from vintage petrol pumps and enamel signs to carved marble fountains & rare furniture.



#### Maldon

The town was declared "Australia's first notable town" in 1966 by the National Trust of Victoria, who explained that the township displays overall historical and architectural importance, particularly in its gold town buildings. The significance lies in the variety of building styles, and the area of mining is of interest with one mine still open to the public. Maldon boasts that it is largely unchanged since the 1850s and has attracted considerable interest from tourists for its 19th-century atmosphere.



#### **Book Heaven**

Located in a small town just on the outskirts of
Castlemaine, Book Heaven is the peak of country
second-hand bookshops. Huge and rambling, the books
are spread over a series of rooms connected by small
passages and doorways.



Stoneman's occupies a beautiful old country building in the centre of Castlemaine. It combines tall, sweeping ceilings, mismatched bookshelves, and a welcoming open-plan layout into a single, complete package.

There's a large selection of contemporary fiction, as well as lovely special editions of timeless classics.
