Member Speaker

Peter Jeffries

Born in Jeffries Road near Gunnedah, I rode horses to a tiny bush school and later boarded in Tamworth for high school. At 14, I started working nights in the Tamworth flour mill lab while finishing school, later earning Milling Engineering and Management certificates. By 20, I was managing my first flour mill.

Married straight from school, I joined a young team that built Fielders Flour into the Goodman Fielder Group — 32,000 employees by 1996. We expanded into bakeries, stockfeed, starch, and snack foods, supplying McDonalds, Subway, Bakers Delight, and others. The government later broke up the group, and much of it ended in foreign hands.

I built and managed major mills and later became GM Marketing for Australia's statutory grain authority, trading wheat, barley, and oilseeds worldwide — a US\$800 million annual book. My main markets were China and Japan, where I worked for decades, helping fund the Cowra Japanese Gardens and developing massive barley and dairy operations in Inner Mongolia. I even dined twice with President Jiang Zemin.

After deregulation, I founded BODA Steel Silos and Bolted Steel Structures, building grain and food facilities across Australia and the Pacific, employing hundreds. My son Matthew married in Inner Mongolia, and we built a steel house in Gerringong — entirely self-designed and fabricated.



Just as construction began, I was diagnosed with stage 4 bowel cancer, metastasised to several organs. After extreme surgeries and chemo, I miraculously recovered. During treatment, my wife was diagnosed with terminal cancer and passed away. I underwent lung surgery soon after, then endured Covid lockdowns, which ended my businesses and Matthew's marriage.

I eventually finished the Gerringong home, joined the Lions Club, and now enjoy time with my children, grandchildren, and Lorraine. Due to my modified intestine, I'll drive myself on the upcoming Probus trip — easier for "pit stops." Life may be different now, but it's still worth living
