

# Cooking with Maiya Kenny.

If you're looking for a new salad for the upcoming entertaining season or just a very quick meal for the two of you, Gerard & I both thought this was delicious ... and there was no cooking!

I stumbled across it on the Woolies website. You could adapt it to suit yourselves, we didn't have the chilli.

Vietnamese-style chicken salad with peanuts

200g vermicelli noodles

½ hot roast chicken

½ bunch coriander

½ cup roasted unsalted peanuts

350g Asian-style salad kit (see ingredients in the diagram above, or just buy the kit)



- 1. Place noodles in a large heatproof bowl. cover with boiling water. Stand for 5 minutes or until noodles soften. Drain, then return to bowl.
- 2. Meanwhile, shred chicken and discard bones & skin
- 3. Pick sprigs from coriander
- 4. Chop peanuts. Add salad kit, sprouts, coriander sprigs and chicken to noodles
- 5. Spoon into serving bowls. Top with peanuts, crunchy noodles and chilli.
- 6. Serve

- .... and the things we never had on our tables in the 50s and 60s were **elbows** and **mobile phones**!






