GPO Heritage Tour: 25 and 27 June

The Sydney GPO as we know today was constructed in two stages beginning in 1866. Designed under the guidance of the Colonial Architect, James Barnet, it is composed primarily of local Sydney sandstone. The northern facade has been described as 'the finest example for the Victorian Italian Renaissance Style in NSW'.

Newcastle Tour and Walk: 20 – 21 May

Our Newcastle tour proved to be an adventure of records and challenges.

We had a record number of travellers for a Roseville Probus tour – 46 and with zero last minute cancellations. But Newcastle was in the middle of flooding rains – 152mm in four days that included the period we were there.

Our challenges included the railway line being blocked by floods near Newcastle. Our train travellers, as well as a journey of two trains and one light rail that was planned, also received a bonus coach trip through the suburbs of Newcastle to add even more value to their \$2.50 fare.

Dinner in our own private function room at Noah's on the Beach, with unlimited drinks, was enjoyed. And there was no need to brave the inclement weather outside.

Our walk on the second day along the Bathers Way was modified in view of threatening conditions. This provided an opportunity for walkers to return to the hotel at any stage. A hardy group of ten reached the halfway point and a decision was made to continue on to the end of the walk and catch the bus back. We set off and were immediately rewarded by drenching rain for the rest of the walk.

Fortunately, we arrived at our destination, the Merewether bus stop, just in time, but did not proceed very far. The road was blocked 100 metres ahead, and the bus driver took the wrong turn and became lost and unable to find a way out.

After profuse apologies, the driver contacted the bus depot for assistance, and 20 minutes later reinforcements in the form of two extra staff arrived and guided the driver along a very narrow road with cars parked on both sides, and back to the normal route. After this scenic bus journey through the back streets of Newcastle we finally were able to return to our hotel. And we did not require compensation - all this was at no charge as the Opal machine on board was out of order. A second bonus free bus journey for the tour.

So all in all, we had a very eventful two days in Newcastle.
