The birth flowers for November are the chrysanthemum and the peony. Chrysanthemums are the official birth flower cultivated in China since the 15th century BC. It comes in a wide variety of colours, each with its own meaning, and represents friendship, honesty, joy, and loyalty. and symbolize friendship, joy, and good luck, while the peony is a lesser known second birth flower for the

month. In ancient Greece, the peony was associated with healing and protection

and was named after Paeon, the god of medicine.



The gemstones for November are Citrine and Topaz. Citrine is known for its warm yellow-to-orange hues, while Topaz is available in a wide spectrum of colours, including blue, pink, yellow, and the highly sought-after imperial orange red. The Citrine is associated with the meaning of joy, abundance, and success. Topaz comes in many colours, with yellow and blue being common, but also pink, brown, and even colourless varieties. "Imperial Topaz" is the name for the rare and valuable orange-to-reddish-orange variety. Topaz symbolizes strength, wisdom, and protection.

Both of these gemstones are believed to bring warmth, fortune, and calming energies to the wearer.
