








### Congratulations to our Probians Celebrating their Birthday in September 2025!

## Guest Speaker: Rick Saul – IT Guru on Scam Prevention

Rick Saul, an information technology expert, gave an enlightening talk on protecting ourselves from scams. He emphasized the importance of awareness, using strong passwords, enabling multifactor authentication, and keeping devices regularly updated.

Rick also highlighted the risks of continuing to use outdated iPhones and Android devices, which are far more vulnerable to security breaches.

Members were introduced to **IDCARE**, a national support service

sponsored by banks, the Australian Defence Force, and the Federal Police, which helps people prevent and recover from scams.

Finally, Rick stressed that **time is critical** if you do fall victim to a scam:

- Phone your bank immediately
- Reach out to a trusted friend who can provide support and help reduce stress

The One-Percent Club Here's a synopsis of an opinion piece by Merv Bartlett that was published in the Courier Mail on 15<sup>th</sup> May 2025. Many of us may find it interesting reading. Merv Bartlett paid tribute to individuals born between 1930 and 1946, who are now aged 79 to 95 years old and are part of the rare "one-percent club," as 99% of their peers globally have passed away. Bartlett reflects on the unique experiences of this generation, including living through rationing, milk deliveries, and a childhood without television, relying instead on imagination sparked by radio. He highlights their resilience, independence, and the post-war era of security and opportunity they enjoyed. This generation witnessed a world free from modern threats like terrorism and global warming, and Bartlett describes them as having "lived in the best of times." He concludes by celebrating their longevity and the privilege of being part of this remarkable group.

## Our Second Guest Speaker - John Oxenford

"Get Your Bum into Gear" – While it usually means "work harder," today it was Rotarian John Oxenford's clever way of introducing the very important topic of bowel cancer testing.

John reminded us that bowel cancer has one of the highest survival rates **if detected early**. As many know, the Federal Government sends out free bowel cancer test kits to everyone aged 45 to 74, yet the take-up rate is surprisingly low. Interestingly, John noted that when people actually *pay* a few dollars for a test kit, the participation rate is much higher – human nature at work!

His message was clear and timely: doing the test is simple, quick, and could save your life.



What fashion trend from your youth do you secretly wish would come back?


