Michele is a proud mum and grandmother, with two sons, three grandsons and two granddaughters. She now enjoys a peaceful life in Caboolture Retirement Village.


Career highlight: A career in retail as a supervisor and buyer.

TOURS EVENTS AND OUTINGS


Previous group tours have been popular and successful. We have two potential tours in preliminary planning stages for 2026 and I need to know interest by members so that I can proceed further.

7-day tour on Gulf Savannahlander for July or August 2026 (travel to Cairns and back by train). The final prices for 2026 won't be available until September this year, but, depending on whether you have a concession or want single accommodation, cost is estimated at \$2,600. It's very likely that an overnight stay in Cairns would be required because of timetables for both trains. For us to be considered a "group" we will need to book ten rooms, though tour could slill go ahead with less.

7-day Murray River cruise on Princess Discovery with Kangaroo Island tour and Adelaide stay. Firm prices also not available just yet but estimate is \$2,700- plus airfare. Month of travel for this potential tour has not been decided.
