Melissa Boucher – Essential Nutrition and Lifestyle for Healthy and Active Aging (Mind, Body & Soul)



Melissa Boucher has been a Clinical Nutritionist for over ten years. She owns Nourish with Zest Nutrition & Wellbeing Clinic in the Hunter Valley, where she consults part time. She is a retired endurance triathlete who has competed in hundreds of triathlons and long-distance running events, including marathons and ironman triathlons.

Melissa has three children (two at university and one finishing school). She is also the Emergency Management Coordinator at Cessnock Council, where she supports the Council and the community to improve preparedness, response and recovery to local emergencies and disasters.

She is passionate about empowering people to live their life to the full by putting their health and wellbeing first. She advocates a sensible, practical and pleasurable approach to nutrition and life and will speak to our Probus Club about the importance of protein and other nutrients for healthy aging and how needs and absorption change with age.

She will also outline the types of food to eat to support healthy brain function.

Last Month's Speaker: Synopsis

Lindsay May, OAM, - The highlights of Ocean Racing



There are many ocean races around the world including the *Newport-Bermuda Race* which has a history starting in 1906, the *Fastnet Race*, an offshore biennial race starting in Cowes, England, now finishing in Cherbourg France and founded in 1925, and our own *Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race* which began in 1945.

The Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race began as a cruise when Peter Luke and some friends formed a club for cruising as opposed to racing to celebrate the end of WWII. In 1945 Captain John Illingworth, who

had served in the British navy during the war and who was organising repairs in Sydney for the British Pacific Fleet, was invited to join but promptly suggested it should be a race. The Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race was born. Illingworth skippered his newly acquired yacht *Rani* to win the race on both line and handicap honours, something that is still extremely rare.

The race has grown over the decades to now attract maxi yachts from around the world. The Boxing Day race run by the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia is watched by thousands both on and off the water. It is one of the few races where you can view the yachts from the marina before they sail.

Lindsay explained that there are compulsory weather briefings before the race and that technology is now used to track the currents during the race. He relayed some delightfully funny stories, and we saw some wonderful photos of life aboard in a Sydney to Hobart race. Lindsay has sailed in 50 Sydney to Hobarts and skippered the yacht *Love and War* in 2006, winning handicap honours.
