1/2 cup sultanas
1/2 cup walnut pieces
1 stick celery, diced
4 shallots, chopped
2 tablespoons chopped glazed ginger
4 dried apricots, chopped

DRESSING

1/4 cup orange juice
2 tablespoons oil
1 clove garlic, crushed
1 teaspoon grated green ginger
2 teaspoons honey
1 teaspoon lemon juice

Cook rice until tender, drain, cool
Toast pinenuts in moderate oven 5-8 mins

Combine all ingredients in a salad bowl, toss well with Dressing. Cover, refrigerate several hours before serving.

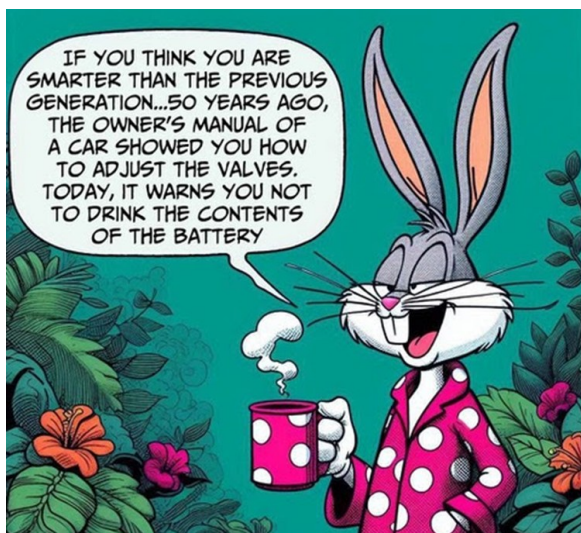
DRESSING: Combine all ingredients in a screw top jar, shake well.

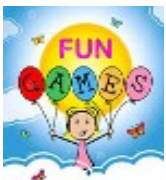

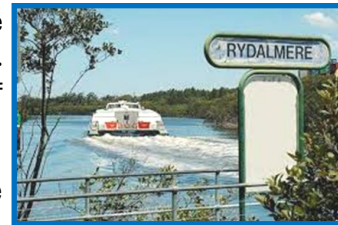
PICNIC WALK

RYDALMERE WHARF

We were last at this location mid 2023 during a period of upgrading and we will meet at 10.30am at Rydalmere Wharf, Rydalmere. The car park is located in John Street, Rydalmere. From Kissing Point Road in Dundas turn south on Park Road, cross over Victoria Road proceed to the roundabout on South Street, turn left and then turn right onto John Street. The car park for the ferry wharf is about 300 metres down on the right. There is a new toilet block adjacent to the wharf and two BBQ sheds east along the riverside walk about 100 to 150 metres away towards Silverwater Bridge where we propose to set up.

The walk will be an out and back walk along the river path, under Silverwater Bridge towards George Kendall Riverside Park, we will stop after about 20-25 minutes. Alternately, walkers may turn around and return at any time before that, if considered more suitable.



In case the BBQ sheds are occupied please bring a chair. There is plenty of shade in the park. One warning, the path is also used by cyclists.

The March and April walks will be our annual signature walks at Manly and Watsons Bay.

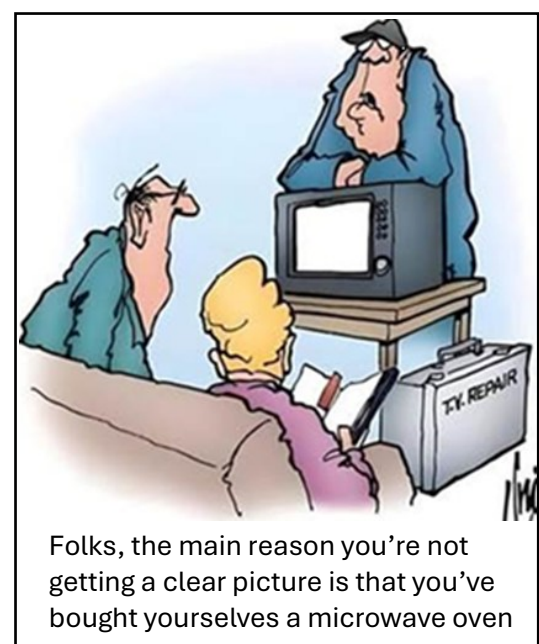
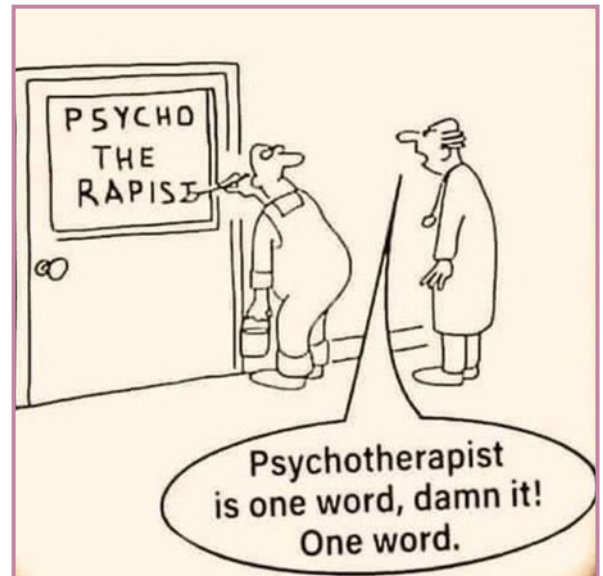
