Annie Pateman

The Strength Within

Colin Goodrem IPP welcomed speaker **Annie Patemen**, who spoke about the challenging experience of experiencing cancer whilst pregnant with her second child. Thanks to Club member, **Arlette Pat**, **Annie's** sister, for providing the report below:

Annie Pateman has faced more medical hurdles than the average person. Yet it is the positive way she addressed these moments that sends a stirring and sometimes humorous message to us all and led to the writing of 'The Strength Within'.

At the age of 26, Annie had already attended at least 10 doctors who had failed to diagnose the cause of her excruciating pain. Weighing 42 kilos and six months pregnant, she demanded that a specialist assess the tennis ball sized lump above her knee.

Thus began Annie's biggest challenge. A biopsy confirmed the tumour was bone cancer. Despite the prognosis that the baby was highly unlikely to survive the trauma of the surgery to amputate above the knee, Dave and Annie made the decision to go ahead with the surgery as she and the baby would both "...fight to survive."

Subsequent treatment for Annie and the 'prem' Jessica, meant they needed to be separated in different hospitals.
Chemotherapy, rehabilitation, living in Gippsland, and not forgetting the care of her 3-year-old toddler Luke, added to the

complexity of the situation. Thankfully with the assistance of family and friends they pulled through.

One would have thought from this beginning that life should slip into the mundane. Yet Annie continues to defy the odds despite further health issues and even natural disasters, as documented in her book. The courage to try new experiences eg travel, reflect Annie's philosophy to "...trust your instincts and cherish every day you have on this earth." Lost badges – If any member has lost their badge, please contact me and I will replace it at a cost of \$13.00.


Medical Record Card – For those members requiring one, I will have copies of the Medical Record Card at the next General Meeting.


