Speakers - Judith Timpson



Our next Speaker is Judith Dunn, AOM (for services to history and heritage), a migrant with a passion for Australian history.

Those of you who did the Parramatta tour will know Judith and her ability to make history come to life. She holds a Fellowship in Colonial History, is Past President and served on the Society Council of Parramatta & District.

Judith is the recipient of a number of awards including the Australian Centenary Medal, a gold medal in the Women of Australia Award, NSW State Government Award for services to History and Heritage, and, in her capacity as teacher, achieved a NSW State Government Quality Teaching Award

Judith will be speaking on "Parramatta Industrial School for Boys – also known as St Vincents Boys Home.

The fascinating story of its gradual evolvement from an industrial school for Catholic boys of the neglected classes in Surry Hills in 1891, into an industrial boarding school for 285 boys at Westmead will be told with the aid of many early photographs contrasted against modern photos.

The story of the school, its buildings and people has been neglected over the years and is crying out to be properly recorded.

ATTENTION: PROBUS WALKERS AND LUNCHERS

7th October walk and lunch will be our final event of the year, and we invite all members, whether walkers or just "lunchers" to join together for a convivial picnic at the "Sugar Loaf", Harold Reid Reserve, Middle Harbour.

We will be spending a relaxing time surrounded by native bush and spring wildflowers within the Harold Reid Reserve, on the peninsula overlooking Middle Harbour at Middle Cove.

Reach the Reserve by turning east off Eastern Valley Way onto Greenfield Ave at Middle Cove, which then forks to the right into Rembrandt Drive.

Follow Rembrandt Drive until it reaches the gates to the Reserve, a pristine peninsular of native bush, with a large picnic area and toilet sited on the very top section called the "Sugar Loaf".

WALKERS - park in the street outside the gates to meet at 10am.

We will walk along the (one way) narrow road which encircles the "Sugarloaf"; this provides an easy, tarred surface, with gentle uphill slopes in a few places, shaded by native bush.

Our destination is a magnificent lookout over Middle Harbour/Sugarloaf Bay at the far end of the circle, followed by a pleasant stroll and lunch (around 11.45am) in the nearby picnic area.

Bring your lunch with you, as well as water, a hat, comfortable shoes, sunscreen, insect repellant, camera, etc. After lunch, we return via the second leg of the road.

LUNCH COMPANIONS – BYO Lunch! - should aim to arrive at the Reserve Gates around 11.30am.

Drive slowly along the one way road within the Reserve, and make a sharp right turn at the far end to access the picnic area on the "sugar loaf". There is easy parking here, picnic settings, and a toilet.

If you like, please join us at the lookout (turn left and down from the picnic area) for the sparkling view, before a convivial lunch.

There should be lots of spring colour. Canny walkers may opt to hitch a ride back by car, or organise to collect your lunch from a driver...
