



Probus Survey findings

Probus clubs throughout Australia were surveyed on a number of issues. A message from the organisers reports:

I would like to personally thank everyone that responded to our survey. We had almost six thousand responses and I would like to share some of the key messages with you.

Who are Probus members?



58% are long-term members (6+ years)



69% joined through word-of-mouth



Top motivations – Activities (75%) Make friends (74%)



95% are retired 5% semi-retired



87% live outside retirement villages



63% retired for 10+ years

Not every person responded to all the questions: the statistics below refer to those that responded.

- 87 per cent of respondents have been retired for more than five years.
- 13 per cent live in retirement villages; 87 per cent do not.
- 42 per cent have been in a Probus Club less than 5 years; 58 per cent longer than five years.
- 69 per cent heard about Probus by word of mouth.
- 38 per cent of respondents would like their club to be bigger; 62 per cent said no.
- The two main reasons for joining Probus were to make new friends and engage in activities.
- 52 per cent belonged to clubs with between 50 and 100 members: 27 per cent belonged to clubs between 100 and 150 members. A small number of clubs were either larger than 150 or smaller than 50.
- 88 per cent said Probus is meeting their needs; 12 per cent said no.
- When asked if it was appropriate to open new clubs where older clubs were closing, 26 per cent said yes, 45 per cent said no, and 29 percent were unsure.
- Social connection and participation in activities were the two most popular aspects of Probus membership.
 82 per cent said they were likely or very likely to recommend Probus to a friend, neighbour or family.






Jan Hosking has left the Management Committee because of commitments with family members' health, but says she is maintaining a definite interest in Probus activities and hoping to see us at events where possible.
