
Dan is part of the team at Nurse Next Door Melbourne North, based in Greensborough. Dan's topic is *Navigating the New Support at Home Program*.

BELEURA HOUSE AND GARDEN TOUR

On 20 November 16 members visited this historic Heritage listed National Trust property in Mornington and what an amazing place it is.

On arrival at Beleura we were taken into the dining room where we had a delicious morning tea of tea or coffee and minced tarts, and we listened to a fascinating introductory talk from Martin about the history of the property. Lunch was equally tasty.

The Italianate Villa house was built in 1863 for a Scottish merchant James Butchart who unfortunately didn't get to enjoy the property, having died on the steps of the property in 1869 at the age of 48.

After a succession of different owners between 1870 to 1916 which included successful businessmen, industrialists, graziers and politicians Beleura was purchased by Sir George and Lady Tallis in fact they were so attracted to an auction of a subdivision of Beleura into 183 lots that they bought the lot! Of course, later they bought additional land to complement the parcel of land they already owned.

Sir George was a theatrical entrepreneur who for many years was Chairman of the global entertainment company J.C. Willamson Ltd. which toured plays and musical theatre in Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and London.

Sir George and Lady Tallis continued the traditional use of Beleura as a seaside house and had four children. Lady Tallis died in 1933 and Sir George in 1948 after spending time developing Beleura as a farm in his retirement.

In 1948 Sir George's youngest son, John Tallis, took over Beleura by making a deal with his siblings.

John was a composer who contributed to post war Australian Ballet productions, and he dedicated his life to the preservation of Beleura. He worked on developing the gardens, inspired by his European travels. John Tallis died in 1996 and bequeathed Beleura, its collections and The Tallis Foundation to the people of Victoria.

The numerous rooms in the house were very impressive with typical high ceilings and bright colors, even ceiling frescos, though I'm not sure they were a hit as John didn't like the finished works and in fact refrained from using those rooms. The rooms were filled with period collections of numerous valuable artefacts, furnishings and housewares from John's family's interest in collecting European Art to many ordinary items used in daily personal life. There are some 26,000 items in the collection.

The gardens have been beautifully planned with a long driveway, many huge specimen trees and a rear stone courtyard, all original features of this nineteenth century seaside garden. Later additions of Lemon Scented Gums, large hedges, reflective pools, and espaliered apple trees surrounding a charming kitchen garden, with antique statuary — collected on trips to Italy, all adding to the allure of venturing from one garden space into another. Beautiful peaceful settings.

Our Garden and House tour guides were most knowledgeable and entertaining.

Writing my Memoir - Speech to Text

Our November guest speaker (Marilyn Martyn - Writing Your Unique Life Story) may have stirred up some *dormant* passion within you to write something, be it a memoir, an autobiography (we now know the difference) or a fiction novel.

'Putting pen to paper' is a *pain* for most of us these days. A 100 page memoir via the keyboard may also be in the 'too hard' basket.

However, many of us have devices at home that allow you to dictate to your computer and have the computer convert your voice into text. It is something that I have used for some time.

The *speech to text function* is part of most modern devices such as desktop computers, laptops, iPads, tablet PCs, iPhones and Android mobiles.

Whether you have a Windows, Apple or other device make sure that you have a microphone which will usually mean that a microphone icon will appear somewhere. Sometimes an internet connection is required.

HAVE YOU TRIED TO <u>DICTATE</u> INTO YOUR COMPUTER? YOU CAN USE YOUR MOUTH INSTEAD OF YOUR HANDS

This entire article is being dictated into my computer. I am not using my fingers to tap any keys on the keyboard at all. I am speaking into a microphone.

You could do this as well on your computer, if you have software that allows you to do it.

In my case I am using a licensed version of Microsoft Word on a Windows 10 computer. My version of Word provides a **Dictate** function. I also have a computer with the necessary microphone.

All I have to do is open **Word**, open a new or existing document, click on the dictate button, and start talking. I can even tell the computer what punctuation I want to insert, so that the document knows my punctuation and my line changes.

This idea is very handy for people who are poor typists, or like me, have a hand out-of-commission, or just want to have some fun. I can also use it to write emails.

Blocking of SPAM Emails

Most, if not all, software applications (sorry Apps) allow you to block specified emails that you do not want to receive. If you do this any subsequent emails from that email address will go into your SPAM folder – and can be subsequently deleted.

The recent email, purporting to be from President Kaye, is a prime example of an email address that should be marked as SPAM or *unwanted*. I have decided that it is too hard to try and write an article to guide you on how to *block* an email address. There are far too many Apps and computing devices for me to research & document.

So I make the following offer:

If you wish to know how to block an email address please provide me with the following:

- Your name and phone number. This is the easy bit. ©
- The type of computing device, such as desktop, laptop, tablet (or iPad), mobile phone.
- The operating system (Windows, Apple, Android). If you do not know this please provide the brand and maybe model number of the device.
- The App that manages your software.

For example I use Microsoft Outlook on a Windows Laptop. I also use the Samsung Email App on a Samsung mobile phone.

Please provide the above information in an email or on paper, not verbally. If you do not know the answers to the above, please provide some words of description.

From the Editor – a starter for *my* Memoire? Cricket is in my blood

In my family, summers are spent watching the cricket, with in-house commentary.

Here's why – my dear old Dad was a cricketer of old and brought us up on the finer points of the game. If you have an hour or two or three, try looking through old newspapers in *Trove*.

The earliest newspaper report I found was *Allan Hoy, captain of the Liverpool Cricket Club* (NSW), 1932. He appears in papers of 1935, 36, 37, 38 and 39 as captain of either Liverpool Cricket Club or Moorebank Cricket Club. They played in the A Grade competition of the Southern District Cricket Association. Liverpool Cricket Club was reformed at full strength after the war, 1946. Dad was captain again. The last report I found was in 1951, where Dad had the best batting average in the Region.

A snippet from March 1936: "Undoubtedly, the greatest credit is due to Allan Hoy, as captain - his handling and placing of his team should be taken note of by other skippers in the competition for future reference."

Bring on the Ashes – let's hope the remaining tests last for more than 2 or 3 days.
