Cryptarithms

A cryptarithm is a mathematical puzzle where the digits in a sum have been replaced by letters.

In each of the puzzles below, each letter stands for a different digit.

Bearing in mind that none of the numbers below have 0 as a leading digit, can you find a solution to all of these cryptarithms?

1.	$ \begin{array}{r} A \\ A \\ + A \\ \hline BA \end{array} $	2.	$ \begin{array}{r} B B \\ + A \\ \hline ACC \end{array} $	3.	$ \begin{array}{r} A B \\ + A \\ \hline B C C \end{array} $	4.	$ \begin{array}{r} A B \\ + A \\ \hline C D C \end{array} $

For example:

In Q1, we know that 3 times A ends in A so A has to be 0 or 5.

(Check the other numbers A could be so you understand that step).

We can then see that 3 times 0 being 0 is a silly result (why would we add zero 3 times) and it does not help us find B.

Then 3 times 5 gives 15 so A = 5 and B = 1.

Now you have 3 more to play with

On Thursday 4 December, our last game for the year was won by Gwen Baker with a very high score.


This was followed by our Christmas Lunch. Our thoughts were with Colleen and Eric Woodhead who have never before missed a Mah Jong Christmas lunch.
