- Guest Speaker 11:45am. Gwenda O'Brien introduced Marie Palmer, Sydney Harbour Trust, who will talk on Cockatoo Island. Marie said thank you for inviting her back. Sydney Harbour Trust established in 1998, is now self-funded, has tenants & special events. Receives funding sometimes. 10 sites. Volunteers in admin & research, 20,000 hours. Cockatoo Island is largest island in Syd Harbour. No evidence First Nations people lived there, no water, may have been meeting place for clans. Is World Heritage UNESCO convict site. Best surviving example of colonial expansion through convict labour. Convicts came from Norfolk Island. Some people ask "where are the cockatoos?" Diary of early governors said there were trees & a lot of white birds. Trees were cut down to build shipyards so now lots of seagulls. In 1850, Gother Kerr Mann, engineer, started the Fitzroy dock to service Royal Navy & other ships. Some convicts escaped incl Frederick Ward who became bushranger Captain Thunderbolt. Cockatoo Island became a reformatory for girls & orphan girls in 1871 & was renamed Biloela. 1871-1906 Boys Training School. In 1890 Sutherland Dock built in 2 years with paid labourers. Bernard Kieran 1886-1905, swimmer, trained at Cockatoo Island. Was Australia's first world champion swimmer. 1913 Naval Dockyard, 1914 machine shops. In 1918 the powerhouse was built. In WWII was major defence centre for vital repairs. The last CEO was John Jeremy. Closed 1991, a lot of equipment sold. The last ship built there was HMAS Success. Also the Codock plane was built there. Two tunnels on Island, 1 closed. Need extra volunteers to man cafes. \$10 self guided audio, guided tours for groups, can stay on Island. Oral History if you worked on site, can record your story. Have Facebook & website
