Much of Pat's life was spent in Country Victoria, Ballarat, and later Mildura, so little wonder Pat penned these words last year:


"The firepit is the place to be, as darkness fills the sky, keeping toes warm, as dinner cooks in camp ovens, on hot coals sit by."

Seacliff Probus August Guest Speaker

Our guest speaker, Councillor John Smedley from the Holdfast Bay City Council, discussed several poignant issues affecting our local area. Councillor Smedley began by advertising various council positions and inviting anyone interested to consider joining their committee.

He then addressed the current concern regarding algal bloom. Outside of Covid, this is the most concerning impact on our businesses. The Council has established Common Objectives such as National Response & Market Confidence; Community, Wellbeing & Resilience; as this issue is affecting thousands of businesses. He explained that this algal bloom is primarily a result of two factors: the 2023 Murray River floods, which washed nitrogen based-fertilized soil into the water courses, and the consistently warm winter water temperatures (2.5 degrees warmer). Unfortunately, no solid solution to alleviate this problem has been identified yet.

John spoke about the State Planning Commission initiated Accommodation Diversity Code Amendment referring to Co-located housing and Co-living housing in existing suburbs.

- Co-located housing is a new class of housing that refers to a group of two or more homes that share gardens and some amenities. It always includes an existing established home that forms part of the co-located housing development and encourages 'adaptive re-use' to modify the existing housing and incorporate it into the co-located housing design.
- To enhance housing diversity a new form of 'Co-living' accommodation for residences is being introduced, that rely on shared kitchen and/or bathroom facilities.
- Allowing increased building height up to 4-6 storeys for large retirement facilities and supported accommodation developments to respond to the significant demand

John urged members to speak with their local councillor before the March 2026 elections to share your views on this matter. Existing residents are already facing problems such as increased traffic and parking issues. These developments seem to wrongly enable apartment-style living in areas that cannot accommodate extra density, leading to a higher population in suburbs where service facilities are already struggling to manage.


