Speaker Summary for September

Our speaker, **Rosy Moar**, **is a forensic toxicologist with** Public Health and Forensic Science (PHF). Her role includes the reporting of alcohol, drug, poisons and other materials of interest in biological samples such as blood and tissue. The reports go mainly to the police and coronial services. Rosy is one of only three people in New Zealand who can report officially on blood alcohol levels. Her work often requires her to give evidence to the courts. She provided simple explanations of the complexities of sampling, measuring and reporting on the materials submitted for testing. A few case studies amplified these explanations. We await with interest whether our President will take up an offer to report on the purity of his drug cache should he take up a new career as a dealer.
