



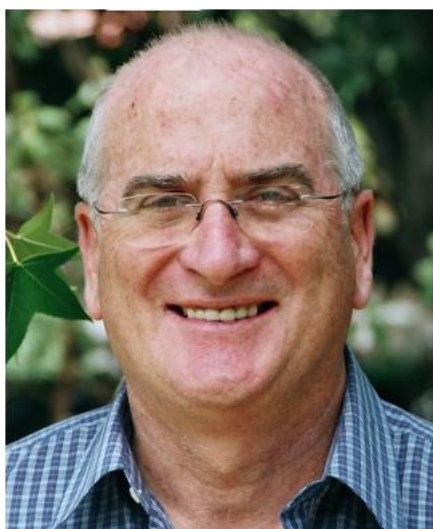

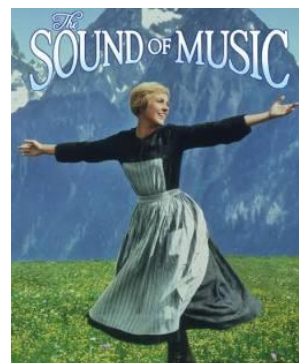

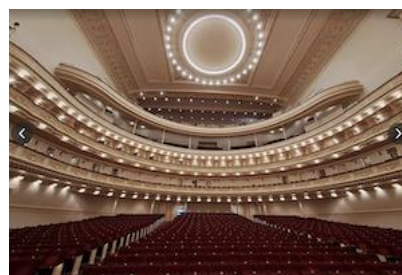

SUMMARY OF ROLES IN CLUB MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The role of the Management Committee is to manage the club in accordance with the Club's constitution, by-laws and or standing resolutions. The key to a successful club is effective leadership and regular activities and the Committee initiates these activities.

Committee members are elected at the Club AGM

President

The main role of the President is to provide leadership and direction to the Management committee to ensure their club embodies the true spirit of Probus - fun friendship and fellowship. Chairs meetings and is aware of administrative needs and looks to encourage members in activities.

Vice president

Main role is to assist the President in the above roles and assists Committee members with heavy commitments. Assumes Presidential roles in absence of President.

Secretary

The main role is to support the President to ensure the club functions smoothly . The secretary is responsible for ensuring meetings are effectively organised and minuted. The Secretary is required to maintain up-to-date records and be the key contact point for the club Public Officer. Each club is required by its constitution to have a Secretary. In Victoria incorporated Clubs under law require the Secretary to be designated the Public officer.

Treasurer

The main role of the Treasurer is to ensure that clear and accurate financial records are maintained and that all funds are accounted for. The role does not require accountancy qualification and the number of entries in MN Probus are low and done on Excel. The number of payments is approximately 2-3 per month

Newsletter Officer

Preparation and distribution of a monthly newsletter and currently this is done on the Probus South Pacific format. Provides details of past and future guest speakers, a calendar of outings and activities as well as co-ordinators contact numbers.

Publicity Officer

The role is to raise community awareness of Probus by preparation and distribution of records of events to local newspapers and radio stations. This is a proactive role but there are regular contacts with media and activity coordinators provide base information and photographs.

Outings, Activities and Tours Officer

In MN Probus this role is fulfilled by a sub committee of four. The role requires planning organisational skills, patience and imagination. IT IS EXCITING AND REWARDING.

There are contacts with other Probus groups to provide ideas of interesting or informative activities.

Welfare Officer

The role of the Welfare officer is to keep in touch with sick or bereaved members or those members feeling isolated or lonely or who may be in need of moral support or physical help.

Membership Officer

The Membership Officer is responsible for maintaining up to date membership records, management of membership applications and assisting with membership retention and growth.

General Committee Members.

There are at least two positions in this category and there may also be assistant treasurer, Secretary, Newsletter officer or Publicity officer, etc. so that there are transitions easily made as persons step down from a role.

I invite members to think about these roles and to let members of the management committee know of their interest in helping foster fun, friendship and fellowship in the MN Probus club.
