November Guest Speaker



Professor Gordon Howarth

Having been recipients of Professor Howarth's depth of knowledge before, the committee was eager to welcome him back to fill us in further on his research.

November's talk was about Neutraceuticals and how they are being researched and found to be valuable in the treatment of the debilitating side effects of chemotherapy. One of these side effects is mucositis. Mucositis is the inflammation of the mucous membranes lining the digestive tract, causing

redness, swelling, and sores. It is a common side effect of cancer treatments like chemotherapy and radiation therapy, particularly in the mouth and throat, but can also affect the entire gastrointestinal tract. Symptoms range from pain and burning to a severe inability to eat.

We also found out about just how difficult it is to gain funding for research and the time and effort needed to apply for and receive NHMRC funding.

Prof told us about various types of research and, although a brief talk to us, it was filled with the promise of things to come. He has suggested that he come back in 12 months' time to keep us up to date on the research.
